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
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

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The beginning of VACCA - WHY

VACCA was born of an urgent concern in the Victorian Aboriginal community about the large number of Aboriginal children:

- being removed from their families <u>18-20 times higher</u> than other Australian children
- being victims of non-Aboriginal adoption
- numerous foster care breakdowns
- being placed in institutions


VALS wanted to find placement alternatives and support within the Victorian Aboriginal Community








Aboriginal Culture Pre-Colonisation





3 Key Effects Of Stolen Generations On Aboriginal Families Today

1. Separation from the primary carers

2. Aboriginal parenting skills are undermined and their children are at risk of being removed

3. Loss of culture and connection




Government Policy and Strategy

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

Victoria will be a state where:


- the rich and thriving culture, knowledge and experience of our First Nations peoples are celebrated by all Victorians


VACCA Education Strategy
